On Wednesday, November 9th, the volunteers and sponsors who supported the August 28, 2022 3rd Annual March to Yorktown Day parade in Westfield, NJ will be recognized and thanked for their volunteerism by Westfield Mayor, Shelley Brindle.

Boy Scouts, Scoutmasters, Centennial Temple 246, Miller-Cory Museum Living Historians, Westfield Chapter Daughters of the American Revolution, New Jersey State Sons of the American Revolution Color Guard and Corporate Sponsors, Trader Joe's, Westfield Inn and PNC Bank will be among those recognized.

The Washington-Rochambeau National Historic Trail represents the route that French and Continental troops marched along on the way to carry out the siege of Yorktown, VA causing the British to capitulate in the final campaign of the Revolutionary War. President Obama signed legislation in 2009 designating the 700 mile trail corridor across land and water, a national historic trail, a unit of the National Park Service.

Because a Continental column led by General Benjamin Lincoln, passed through Westfield on August 29, 1781, Mayor Shelley Brindle, proclaimed that every August 29th will be celebrated as "March to Yorktown Day" in Westfield.
